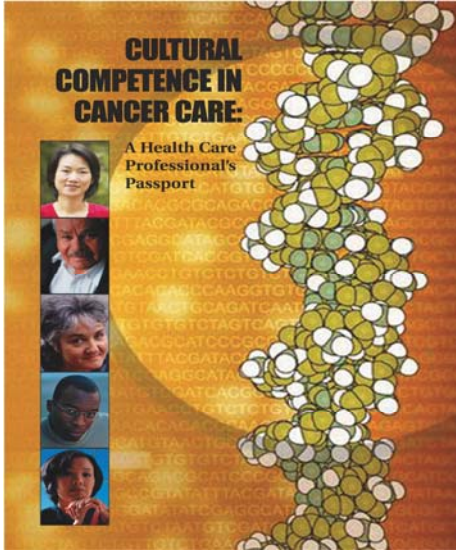

Excerpts:

African American/Blacks - are confronted with "pain" as are other racial/ethnic groups, and therefore, should be treated accordingly with pain medication and a pain management plan for cancer or any other chronic disease in which pain is associated

American Indians and Alaska Natives (AIAN) – Cancer is regarded as "white man's disease" and traditional Indian healers encourage tribal patients to use Western medicine in combination with traditional Indian medicine and spiritual healing processes

Asian American – The diversity of the Asian American populations lies, not only in the multiple countries of origin and multiple languages (a total of more than 80 languages or dialect subcultures), but also varying levels of acculturations in the United States

Appalachians – Some Appalachians have a strong belief in folk medicine and may use a variety of home remedies, herbal medicine, poultices and teas

Latinos/Hispanics – The term "Latino" and "Hispanic" are used in this Pocket Guide and refer to persons of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, other Central and South American or Spanish origin

Native Hawaiian and other Pacific Island Populations – Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islanders honor and nurture relationships, their ancestors, and their "traditional" land
